POLICY STATEMENT:

The Jinnah Medical & Dental College (JM&DC) provides a student support program with the goal of enhancing the success of its students in a safe environment. Discipline at JM&DC refers to the rules, regulations and strategies applied to manage student behavior and practices and to encourage them for self-discipline. The philosophy of discipline applies to all individuals and groups within the premises of the JM&DC campuses and affiliated hospitals.

Jinnah Medical & Dental College is committed to:

- Provide a congenial and conducive environment that is essential for the overall growth and development of its students
- Promote learning that, in addition to knowledge and skills, will provide graduates with a wider vision
- Take action against students indulging in activities that are injurious to the interest of students, the college, faculty or others

Students are expected to:

- Adhere to the college policies and abide by the rules and regulations
- Assume personal responsibility for honesty and integrity
- Respect policies, programs, faculty and staff
- Observe generally accepted standards of conduct
- Perform academic activities that promote professional leadership

SCOPE & JURISDICTION:

- 1. This policy applies to all students of the Jinnah Medical and Dental College, here referred as JM&DC as well.
- 2. This applies to any student's unexpected conduct that occurs on the College / University premises or at the College / University-sponsored activities. The policy also applies to off-campus student conduct when it, as alleged, adversely affects JM&DC or University's interest substantially or either:
 - Constitutes a criminal offense as defined by law
 - Indicates that the student may present a danger or threat to the health or safety of others, that might include students, faculty, staff etc.

RESPONSIBILITY:

- 1. Students Affairs Department
- 2. Principals
- 3. Faculty
- 4. Students

GUIDING PRINCIPLES:

- 1. The JM&DC seeks an environment that promotes academic achievement and integrity that serves the educational mission of the College and the University.
- 2. The College seeks a community that is free from violence, threats, and intimidation; that is respectful of the rights, opportunities, and welfare of students, faculty, staff, and guests of the College; and that does not threaten the physical or mental health or safety of members of the College community.
- 3. The College is dedicated to the responsible use of its resources and to protecting its property and resources from theft, damage, destruction, or misuse.
- 4. The College supports and is guided by law while also establishing its own standards of conduct for the academic community.

DISCIPLINARY OFFENSES:

Any student or student group found to have committed or to have attempted to commit any disciplinary offence is subject to appropriate disciplinary action and punishment under this policy.

SANCTIONS:

Sanctions may be imposed upon student (s) found to have violated the policies & procedures and rules & regulations of the University / College for Academic Dishonesty and Cheating During Examinations and for violations other than examination misconduct.

HEARING AND APPEAL OF STUDENT - DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE:

Any student or group of students charged with the violation of the JMDC's Policies & Procedures and or Rules & Regulations shall have the opportunity to receive a fair hearing.

In cases of academic or general misconduct, the College Principal will form a committee comprised of the following members:

Headed by: Principal, Jinnah Medical and Dental College

- 1. Vice Principal
- 2. Head of Department (not belonging to the department that has raised the incident)
- 3. Senior Faculty (not belonging to the department that has raised the incident)
- 4. By Invitation: (based on the nature of incident)
 - Medical Director, Medicare Cardiac & General Hospital
 - Administrator, Medicare Cardiac & General Hospital
 - Director Hospital Administration, Sohail Trust Hospital

PROCEDURE:

- 1. The committee schedules a meeting not later than one week from the date of the incident.
- 2. The committee investigates the incident.
- 3. Alleged student/group is asked to submit written explanation for the incident.
- 4. The committee invites the alleged student/group and conducts hearing that is recorded as well.
- 5. Supervising faculty or affected staff is asked to submit written report of the incident.
- 6. Supervising faculty or affected staff is invited for the hearing that is recorded as well.
- 7. Disciplinary Committee prepares report of the incident with recommendations and submits it to
- 8. The College Principal to determine the appropriate action(s).
- 9. The decision is communicated to both the parties.
- 10. If allegations are proved, the decision is included in the personal file of student (s).
